#### **RUBY CLASS**

This week Reception have been learning all about the World around them. They have created passports, discussed different religions and also tried a variety of cuisines, including; Italian, Spanish and French.

Our huge focus for the end of this school year is independence. We ask that you echo this at home when completing homework, celebrating work for having a go independently and continuing to build up their self-confidence.

#### SAPPHIRE CLASS

#### True commitment and dedication are what Sapphire children are all about!

**English** – The new writing unit is all about Gentoo Penguins. We are aiming to produce a skilfully-written chronological report about this group of penguins. We have been researching different interesting facts that you may want to share with your child.

Maths – telling the time is what we have been learning recently. We can tell the time one hour before and after, to the 5 min and we (year 2) are able to read the analogue and digital time. Please continue to practise with your child their time as this is an important life skill to have.

**Science** – Our changing world – Sensing seasons - To identify how the seasons determine how 'our changing world' varies, and to describe the impact that seasonal change has on our lives.

**Religious Education** – We are learning about the stories told in the Bible and the reason why Jesus shared them. Jesus spoke in simple stories or parables as a way of teaching His disciples lessons He wanted them to learn. We started with the story of the sower and we have lately learnt about the lost sheep and how precious it was to his 'Good Shepherd'.

In **PSHE**, we are learning about relationships, important people in our lives, the connection we have with them and the various roles we each hold.

**History**: We are learning about Florence Nightingale, the founder of modern nursing, pioneering nursing profession: her achievements and legacy. The children are already quite knowledgeable about these facts. Florence Nightingale's birthday is on the 12<sup>th</sup> May, so we shall be celebrating and commemorating.

In English, we have been linking our writing to our Geography topic of Coasts. We are writing a letter of complaint to Southend Council about a horrible trip we have been on. The children have enjoyed using formal vocabulary to try and put their point across.

Please ensure your child completes their homework before the deadline as per the timetable sent out to you. There are a lot of children who are not completing the homework each week, and many are leaving it all to the last minute. Homework is vital for their consolidation of what they have learnt but also to ensure essential skills are being practised, that mean they can reach their potential in class.

Times table practise is vital for all year 4's as there is only 4 weeks until their test.

In maths this week we have been focused on ratio and proportion, which can often be a very tricky topic. The children have adapted well to this and have made excellent progress throughout the week, solving some pretty tricky questions towards the end of the week. In History this week we have been focused on World Cultural Events-the children are in the middle of creating Powerpoints explaining different festivals including Holi, Songkran, La Tomatina and Dia De Los Muertos.

In art we have been looking at using different colour shades to create a pattern where we 'took a line for a walk.' The results were amazing-hopefully you can see this in the picture below.

Completed work on developing the protected spring in Uganda.


