# HEADTEACHER'S NEWS SUMMARY NEWSLETTER

The season of advent is upon us as last Sunday was the first Sunday in the period of Advent when we think about how as Christians we prepare for the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day. During the period of Advent, we will be relating to the themes of hope, peace, joy and love which are symbolised by the Advent candles on our Advent wreath (one lit each Sunday of Advent and in our Celebration Assembly every Friday in the lead up to Christmas).

We are also sending home a postcard that was illustrated by Aoife in Yr.4 showing all the different services that will be taking place in the parish of St. John and St. Luke this Christmas. Please do try to make the effort to attend some of these services as your children will really enjoy them, especially the Christingle on Tuesday the 24<sup>th</sup> December at 4pm in St. Luke's Church and the Christmas Day Eucharist Service in St. John's Church at 10.30am.

We are currently supporting the parish of St. John and St. Luke with their Christmas raffle and tickets are on sale very morning for the next week. Tickets are £1, please do try and support our parish as our entire school community is very well supported by our parish, especially by Mother Mitzi.

Please note that all clubs finished this Friday and will start again the week beginning the 13<sup>th</sup> January. #### Maths

This week, we have been exploring the composition of 5, building a strong foundation for early number skills. Using counters, cubes, and their fingers, the children investigated different ways to make 5, proudly sharing their discoveries with one another. Our Christmas elf, Merry, played a special role during the Maths Morning, setting fun challenges for the children and parents to solve together. Thank you to everyone who attended—it was wonderful to see the children so eager to show off their skills and enthusiasm for learning.

#### Literacv

Our mischievous elf Merry has been the spark behind some wonderfully imaginative literacy work. The children have enjoyed making maps of Merry's nightly adventures, writing bedtime stories for him, and designing cozy spaces with snacks for him in our Design and Make area. Their imaginations and writing skills continue to grow, producing work that reflects their developing confidence and creativity.

#### SAPPHIRE CLASS

We are absolutely proud of you Sapphire Class, you are all a pleasure to teach and be around. Keep up the practice: reading, writing, spelling, times tables and most of all the joy!

English – We have just completed a very skilful and thorough piece of description writing about 1666 London, prior to the Great Fire of London. We have explored various writing skills so far including verbs in the present and past tenses, adjectives and noun phrases, expressive punctuation, ambitious vocabulary, paragraphing and many more. Year 2 are certainly making an impressive progress. Year 1 are getting more confident, resilient and most importantly independent.

We are still cross-learning with the **History** unit about the Great Fire of London, facts, causes and consequences.

Maths – The children enjoyed learning about measurements of length and heights, and recently about money, creating their shopping lists as they continue to learn about coins and notes. Please encourage your child to spot the prices and help them recognise the pennies from the pounds.

Science – We are learning about our bodies and senses: touch, sight, smell, hearing and taste through comparing and understanding differences in their features and learn how they help us understand the fundamentals of the human body and the world around us.

Religious Education – Who is the Saint of our school? What is the story of our School's name? We are exploring identity and belonging, values and commitment. Faith is what the children can confidently describe and talk about especially after making those yummy 'Faith-flavoured cookies'.

#### **DIAMOND CLASS**

A rather quiet week in Diamond Class! I hope everyone is feeling much better since we've definitely been hit with a nasty cold. Despite the short number we have been able to complete great learning.

In Maths, we have been looking at statistics. The children collected data and produced a graph about what month of the year each child was born in on Monday. On Tuesday and Wednesday, we focused on pictograms, making sure our key was clear, and we were reading the questions carefully. In English, we have started our final book for this half-term called The Tear Thief. We started by linking emotions to a colour and this week we have been writing a diary entry about the Tear Thief's adventures to steal tears.

In Science, we were able to answer the question 'Why doesn't the stomach eat itself?' by looking at the affect that different liquids have on crackers. We are working our way through the digestive system so will be looking at the small intestine next week!

Geography was particularly exciting this week, the children discovered eight different parts of a compass and have written instructions to give to another pair next week. The children are looking forward to carrying out an expedition around our school.

Next week is assessment week! Please ensure that your child is rested and has a good breakfast! For many, last time was daunting and tricky, but we have learnt a lot since October so the children should see real improvement in their abilities. I would therefore advice, that the children spend a little more time on TTR this weekend to prepare them for their maths tests and have a look over the year 3 and 4 spelling list I sent home at Parents' evening.

MyMaths and TTR have been set as normal.


