Throughout collective worship this week we explored together the meaning of the Epiphany. We celebrated this ancient Christian feast day by using the golden cloth on our special worship table and talked about other times that we would use this golden cloth. Epiphany celebrates the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the River Jordan. It also celebrates Jesus' birth. The Western church began celebrating the Epiphany in the 4th century where it was, and still is, associated with the visit of the magi (wise men) to the infant Jesus when God revealed himself to the world through the incarnation of Jesus. According to Matthew 2:11 they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

Our value for this half-term is: **Endurance** - <u>'I can do all things through Christ because he gives me</u> <u>strength.' Psalm 25:9</u>

Together we explored what endurance means and what it may look like in St. John's School and in our lives in general. We also thought about people in our world who have shown true endurance and through this the great things that they have achieved. SAPPHIRE CLASS

A warm welcome back to all of our wonderful children who continue to be committed as always. A huge thank you to our dear families for your kindness and generosity, really appreciate it.

English – Dear Earth is the focus book for our writing unit this half term. We will be exploring various writing skills. These will include instruction writing, factual statements, descriptive writing using adjectives and noun phrases, leaflet writing, vlogs and poems.

Maths – We continue to consolidate and dive deeper into the four main mathematical operations. The children are certainly getting much better at additions and subtractions recognising number bonds using different methods, mental and written column methods for Year 2 children. Please encourage your child to complete their homework as independently as they can.

Science – Sapphire are learning about 'Everyday materials', they are learning to identify, classify and describe the everyday materials around them, such as wood, plastic, metal, glass and fabric, all through a variety of fun activities and experiments.

Religious Education – 'Why do Christians make and keep promises to God?' as we learn how Jesus' story tells Christians that it is important that promises are not just words, they must be matched up with actions.

In **PSHE**, we are developing our understanding about 'Goals and targets' in life and how realistic they should be

DIAMOND CLASS

Spring term is well and truly flying by! I have been really impressed with attendance and punctuality in Diamond Class since coming back. Our learning starts at 8:45am and often I set a morning task which reviews the previous day's learning and sets them up for the day in the right way. It is also a chance for the children to get extra spelling practice. Please keep this current attitude up because it is really helping the children flourish right from the offset.

In Maths this week, we have revisited multiplication which has been beneficial. It is still a big hinderance that many children don't know their multiplication facts up to 12x12. In Year 3, your child should be confident on 2s, 5s and 10s from Year 2 and be familiar with 3s, 4s and 8s. In Year 4, the above applies and they should be looking to know these under 5 seconds. They also then by this far in the year should be familiar with 6s, 7s, 9s, 11s and 12s also. For many children they get frustrated during lesson time and can't access the material because they are stuck on a multiplication fact.

Ahead of our work on division and then going forward, please make sure that your child is practising their times tables regularly both orally and written. TTRS is great practice, and I recommend this as it is tailored to them through garage play but learning them orally is so important as well.

In English, we have been diving deeper into the Ancient Egyptians which we studied back in Autumn 1. The children have been able to recall a huge amount of information which is great, and we have been directing our knowledge to focus on Tutankhamun and the discovery of his tomb by Howard Carter.

In Science we got to make cup-telephones looking at how sound is able to travel. It would be a great activity for you to complete with your child to get involved in their learning in a practical way. In History, we are investigating how childhood has changed over time diving into various periods of history such as the Romans, Tudors and Victorians. The children have been surprised to find out that during the Tudor period children of 7 would move out of home and go and learn trades such as carpentry and blacksmith.

I can't write this without mentioning swimming. I have been so impressed this week with everyone being able to get into the water and have a go. Many children were nervous but when they got in and quickly discovered it was warm, they quickly forgot about that. Please can I just remind you that no earrings can be worn in the water so please can these be taken out at home to avoid them getting lost at school.

I look forward to another exciting week in Diamond, as always if there are any concerns please don't hesitate to get in touch. MyMaths and TTRS have been set as usual. Have a lovely weekend!

EMERALD CLASS

The holidays seem long gone as we are well and truly into our work. In maths we have been focused on 2D shapes and their properties, measuring angles and drawing shapes to scale. The children have worked hard on understanding how a protractor works and measuring and drawing a range of angles and shapes. In English we are reading the book 'The Lost Thing' by Shaun Tan. This is about a highly unusual character that is presumed lost and what happens to it. This week and next the children are recreating this story with their own unusual, lost thing character.

In science this week we continued our work on focus with an experiment based around friction. The children had to see how quickly they could transfer jelly cubes from one pot to another but with the additional hindrance or help of oil on the jelly and then salt. We had a great lesson which I know the children thoroughly enjoyed.

In history we are studying 'The Tudors'. We have focused on Henry VIII and all of his wives: interesting conversations were had about this! In design and technology our topic is musical instruments; in a couple of weeks' time the children will be making their own musical instrument from recycled materials so please ask them what they are proposing to make so that you can hoard some resources.


